Chamber Maintains Focus on Housing, **Childcare and Conference Center**

I'm excited for the Chamber's forward momentum as we move into 2025. I was fortunate to speak to more than 150 Chamber members and stakeholders at the **Chamber Annual Meeting** on January 21. Windstone Event Center provided a wonderful venue and meal for honoring Gaye Suggett, Ameren, for her year as Chamber Chair, and recognizing retiring board members as well as six new, incoming board members.

One of the highlights of the meeting was when Gave named Ryan Henry the 2025 recipient of the Chair's Award which goes to one volunteer who made the greatest impact on the Chamber overall. Rvan just retired from the Board of Directors after serving six years, including two years as treasurer. Congratulations Ryan!

Also in January, we were pleased to work closely with Governor Mike Kehoe's team on the Governor's Prayer Breakfast hosted on January 15 at Capitol Plaza Hotel. Compliments to Gaye Suggett for accepting that invitation, and props and many thanks to Susan Neill Dawdy of the Chamber staff for her personal efforts on the event.

We continue our focus on three priorities for 2025: housing, childcare, and the conference center. Gary Plummer, Chamber President, joined Paul Samson, Jefferson City Regional Economic Partnership, and others, who testified at the February 18 City Council meeting in favor of Savannah Place, a major housing development. Developers plan to construct 116 single-family homes and townhouses off Rainbow Drive in the northwest portion of our community. We appreciate the City Council voting unanimously in support of the subdivision, which is one of the biggest we've seen in recent years in Jefferson City.

In addition to housing, the Chamber continues to focus on supporting the availability of affordable childcare in

our area. Much of Missouri, including portions of mid-Missouri, are classified as childcare "deserts" which can be a serious barrier to fulfilling our community's workforce needs. The Workforce Coalition, the Chamber, and other public/private partners have been engaged in this issue through advocacy at the Capitol Building. We have also established local partnerships matching major employers with area childcare centers. We are optimistic about the movement on this critical need and expect 2025 to be a turning point for progress in this area.

Finally, we are actively working to share the vision of a new downtown conference center with our affiliate, Civic Progress, with our Board of Directors, and with our entire membership.

Mayor Ron Fitzwater, CVB Executive Director, Diane Gillespie, and JCREP's Luke Holtschneider and Paul Samson, made four presentations to key Chamber groups in March to outline the scope of the project and the resulting economic activity in Jefferson City. We anticipate more information pointing out the project's actual cost and funding, but we're confident in the ability of the team which has been working on it for nearly two years.

Look for announcements by Civic Progress and the Chamber in the next few weeks as the details of this transformational project are unveiled. Both Gary Plummer and I would appreciate your questions and feedback on the conference center proposal anytime.


